Anna Gili is a PhD student in Linguistic, Philological and Literary Sciences at the University of Padua and at the Graduiertenschule für die Geisteswissenschaften (Julius-Maximilians-Universität Würzburg). She obtained a master's degree in Classical Philology and Ancient History at the University of Padua and, at the same time, attended the Galileiana School of Higher Education. Her main research interest is the transmission of medical science from Greek into Arabic and from Arabic into Latin during the Middle Ages. Her PhD project, entitled "Pathology in the Kitāb al-Malakī, the Pantegni and the Liber Regalis: Theorica, books VIII and IX.1-2; 35-39.
